

**Intro to World Music**

- Jewish Religious Music
  - generalizations are problematic
  - Biblical references
    - Psalm 81
    - *shofar* mentioned
    - folk songs and praise songs mentioned
  - Cantillation
    - standardized method of chanting Biblical texts
    - *ta'amim* - signs indicating melodic formulae for chanting
    - Cantillation Reciters
      - Levites - Biblical hereditary caste of professional musicians
      - cantor - performer of chants in contemporary services
- Klezmer Music
  - vigorous folk music for dancing at weddings and other celebrations
  - features
    - *freygish* scale
    - syncopation through "asymmetrical" beat groupings
    - distinctive "wailing" clarinet technique
    - homophony common
    - flexible instrumentation
  - Example: *A Rumenisher Doyne*
    - 1. *doyne* - nonpulsatile improvisatory intro played by clarinet
    - 2. *terkish* - moderate tempo dance style played by entire ensemble
    - 3. return to the *doyne*
    - 4. *freylekhs* - lively duple-meter dance
