- 🗆 Jewish Religious Music
 - generalizations are problematic
 - Biblical references
 - 🗆 Psalm 81
 - 🗆 *shofar* mentioned
 - 🗆 folk songs and praise songs mentioned
 - Cantillation
 - standardized method of chanting Biblical texts
 - 🗆 ta'amim signs indicating melodic formulae for chanting
 - Cantillation Reciters
 - Levites Biblical hereditary caste of professional musicians
 - Cantor performer of chants in contemporary services
- 🗆 Klezmer Music
 - vigorous folk music for dancing at weddings and other celebrations
 - 🗆 features
 - 🗆 freygish scale
 - syncopation through "asymmetrical" beat groupings
 - distinctive "wailing" clarinet technique
 - 🗆 homophony common
 - \Box flexible instrumentation
 - Example: A Rumenisher Doyne
 - 🗆 1. *doyne* nonpulsatile improvisatory intro played by clarinet
 - 2. *terkish* moderate tempo dance style played by entire ensemble
 - \Box 3. return to the *doyne*
 - 🗆 4. *freylekhs* lively duple- meter dance
