Intro to World Music • 🗆 Elements of Central Asia Music • □ portable instruments (Mongolia) □ epic songs • 🗆 multiphonic singing ■ tone-contour melodies • ☐ The Tibetan Monastery • 🗆 religious community of Buddhist monks • spiritualism expressed through and aided by... ■ mandalas • 🔲 mantras ■ music • Tibetan Music Religious Music • for Tibetan monks, music is comprised of two components: • external music which we hear • Internal music of the musician's soul • conceptually related to the book of tantras • ritual music precisely prescribed; improvisation is limited • Dbyangs - chant style where the "melodies" consist of subtle changes in timbre, loudness, and sliding multiphonic frequencies ☐ The Instruments of *Rul-Mo* (Tibetan Ritual Music) • \(\square \) dung-chen - long metal aerophone (large buzzed-lip trumpet) • \square rgya-gling - double-reed aerophone; played with circular breathing technique • 🗆 nga chin - cylindrical membranaphone with a head on either side of the cylinder • \square *kungling* - small trumpet made from a human thigh bone • \square rul-mo - also the name of large metal cymbals played in pairs • ☐ A Tibetan *Rul-Mo* Performance • 🗆 audio: an invocation of Mahakala, protector deity of Tibetan Buddhism • 🗆 excerpt from a puja - an extended ritual of chant, instrumental music and offerings • \square rul-mo cymbals played with a brdung (series of accelerating strikes) • ☐ form of *Mahakala Puja* (excerpt) • First Section: dung-chen are sounded; rul-mo play several brdung • Second Section: new pattern of brdung; kungling are sounded • Third Section: dung-chen and nga chin join in; Dbyangs chant begins, featuring multiphonic singing ■ Tibetan Folk & Art Music • ☐ General: • 🗆 rich body of songs on a variety of topics: love, pastoralism, agricultural work songs • prevalence of pentatonic modes...much more "tuneful" in the Western sense than rul-mo
